

EXISTENCE OF THREE NONTRIVIAL SOLUTIONS FOR A CLASS OF SUPERLINEAR DEGENERATE ELLIPTIC SYSTEMS

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Abstract

We study the degenerate semilinear elliptic systems of the form

$$\begin{cases} -div(h(x)\nabla u) = \lambda(a(x)u + b(x)v) + F_u(x, u, v), & x \in \Omega, \\ -div(h(x)\Delta v) = \lambda(d(x)v + b(x)u) + F_v(x, u, v), & x \in \Omega, \\ u|_{\partial\Omega} = v|_{\partial\Omega} = 0, \end{cases}$$

where $\Omega \subset R^N(N \ge 2)$ is an open bounded domain with smooth boundary $\partial \Omega$, the measurable, nonnegative diffusion coefficient h is allowed to vanish in Ω (as well as at the boundary $\partial \Omega$) and/or to blow up in $\overline{\Omega}$. The existence of three nontrivial solutions for the superlinear degenerate elliptic systems is obtained by using variational theorems of mixed type due to Marino and Saccon and Linking Theorem.
